



The books offered below are subject to prior sale.

1. A catalogue of various prints, by the most eminent artists. Published by Thomas Simpson, St. Paul's Church-yard; and Darling and Thompson, Great Newport-street, printsellers, &c. to the Duke and Duchess of York. London, 1794. 8:o. 32 pp. Sewn as issued in wrappers. Handwritten title on the slightly damaged spine. A small hole on pp. 7-8. Nice copy. A pencil note on front wrapper from the library of Säftstaholm. £450

Dated 1 July 1794. Ends with a section of "drawing books". Probably acquired by Gustaf Trolle-Bonde (1773-1855) during his European grand tour in 1794-96.

Lower corner on back wrapper torn away. Spine darkened. Fine copy with some minor insignificant stains and a small hole in the outer margin on p. 141. £1200

Bibliotheca danica IV:572. The first sequence of pagination contains a list of scientific instruments, maps and graphic

prints and the second of books. A foreword by Frederik Ekkard. The collector Johann Samuel Augustin (1715-85) was born in Silesia and worked as a Danish official. From an early age he took an interest in mathematics, astronomy and geography, which this library clearly shows.


Almquist Sveriges bibliografiska litteratur 4439. Part I lists books in folio and quarto, which were sold in Uppsala in October 1787; part II octavos and duodecimos, which were sold in Stockholm in February 1788. As the fine book collection went under the hammer, a few coins and two globes by Åkerman were also sold and they are listed in the appendix in part II. At this auction, Uppsala university library bought the fourth part of Rudbeck's "Atland". Carl Aurivillius (1717-86) was professor of oriental languages at the university of Uppsala. His extensive library, which was particularly rich in philology and theology, was one of the best in Sweden at the time.

Almquist Sveriges bibliografiska litteratur 3138. This catalogue registers the collection, mostly gathered as war booty, still preserved in the Strängnäs cathedral. The library consists almost exclusively of books printed in the 15th and 16th centuries and the first decades of the 17th century.

Ignatius Mouradgea d'Ohsson (1740-1807) worked at the Swedish embassy in Constantinople. He was encouraged to write and carry on research by his superior, Gustaf Celsing and his brother Ulric, who also helped him to distribute

the finished work "Tableau general de l'empire othoman", whose first two parts were published in 1787-90.



Hesse Svensk numismatisk bibliografi o883-84. Both works describes archeological findings just south of Stockholm

consisting of two pots with lids encircled by "spiral-rings". The Director-General of the National Heritage Board and Secretary to the Royal Academy of Letters, History and Antiquities, Jonas Hallenberg (1748-1834), was a historian in the spirit of Voltaire. His vast production includes several works on numismatics. As a numismatist, he became famous for his research on Arabian coins.

(LIND, LAURITZ) **Det danske bibliotek eller fortegnelse paa alle de danske skrifter/ som ere trykte baade inden og uden lands/ fra det første bogtrykkerier kom i stand i Dannemark/ indtil sidst i forige seculo, hvilcke alle findes samlede i det danske bibliotek som dend høy-ædle og velbaarne frøken frøk. Hinges with cracks and the skin partly flaked. Corners worn and nicked. A partly erased signature in the outer margin on titlepage. In conjunction to that, small holes have developed which have been mended later. Minor soiling in the upper margin on p. 48, a faded dampstain on pp. 165-66 and a larger one on pp. 175-87, plus a minimal repair in the lower part of the inner margin on p. 192. With Frederik Heyman's book plate and from the collection of Bent Juel in Oxford. £900

Bibliotheca danica IV:565. Karen Brahe (1657-1736) received an exceptional education for a woman of her time and gathered a considerable library. In 1708 she moved to Østrupgaard on the island Funen in Denmark, where she lived her last 28 years, busy with literature and energetic husbandry. In 1716 she founded the noble "maidish convent" in Odense, to which she donated her valuable book collection, which to a greater extent was comprised of older Danish manuscripts and printed books plus German theology. Among the many manuscripts in the library is an im-

portant collection of folk songs and among the printed volumes are many of the oldest Danish books, some of which are unique copies. The collection is the oldest preserved Danish private library and probably one of the oldest libraries, collected by a woman, in the world. This catalogue lists the Danish books and contains a long introduction about the donator and the library.

Gilt numbering on spines. Part I has some wormholes in the outer margin on the first 200 pages. Minor stains towards the end and with some wormholes in the upper margin. Part II mostly printed on blue-toned paper. A mended tear in the uppermargin on p. 333. Foxing in the latter half in the lower corner. Wormholes from p. 51 to the end of the last pagination sequence, mostly in the outer margin, but towards the end also with some loss of letters. A black stamp, "JLS" or "JSL". Nice copy. £1000

Bibliotheca danica IV:583. The last sequence of pagination has the headline "Libri manuscripti". Inspired by his uncle Christen Worm, Bolle Willum Luxdorph (1716-88) started to collect books at an early age and at his death his library comprised around 15000 volumes and 500 manuscripts. It was one of the best Danish private libraries of its time. The subjects were mainly liberal arts and there were also a large number of Danish and foreign periodicals. This catalogue has a number of interesting foot notes related to the

books. Books from Luxdorph's library are recognized by his gilt crest with a head of an elephant whose trunk is crowned and penetrated with three arrows. Usually it is placed on the front board, but sometimes also on the spine.

First published in German in 1783. Besides being an engraver, Christian von Mechel (1737-1817) also worked as an art dealer and as a publisher. He is known for, among other things, his engravings of Hedlinger's medals. The collection, which was structured by Mechel after styles and countries, contained 1300 different works.

Carl Johan Fant (1798-1875) worked as a librarian at the Uppsala University Library and eventually became the head of that institution.

Jan van Dyk (ca 1690-1769) was an art expert but most of all an art restorer.

Filippo Venuti (1709-69) was an Italian archeologist and writer of dictionaries. Hugh, 15th Baronet of Willoughby of Parham (1713-65) was like Venuti a fellow of the Royal Society. Anthony Lefroy was an English banker in Livorno.

18. WESTERGAARD, N. Niels Ludvig Westergaard (1815-78) was a senior master of oriental philology in Copenhagen and published a large amount of literature to facilitate the education of Sanskrit. A large part of his research was focused on Indian and Iranian scripts, languages and history. Peder Goth Thorsen (1811-83) was librarian at the library of Copenhagen university. He was also a rumologist and historian. According to a note on the inside of the front board, this off-print was published in 25 copies on Thorsen's initiative. It is taken from Westergaard's great catalogue "Codices indici Bibliothecæ regiæ Hauniensis. Subjungitur index codicum Indicorum et iranocorum Bibliothecæ universitatis Hauniensis" and thus consists of the part of the catalogue which registers the university library collection.

Almquist Sveriges bibliografiska litteratur 1840. Krok Bib-lioteca botanica suecana 17. A bibliography of botanical literature published in Sweden until 1831. The author chose to ignore works which only dealt with exotic plants.
